

## Interdisciplinary Project Presentations at Retreat

We have asked students to present on their interdisciplinary projects at the retreat to share information and ideas, and allow an opportunity for feedback. We believe this will lead to the best products possible. The presentations are not formal, but you should take some time to prepare with your group members. Power point slides are optional. Talks should be between 5 and 10 min.

Use this outline to organize your talk:

1. Proposed Project Title
2. Project Investigators (all participating students – include area(s) of expertise and objective team number for each person)
3. Explain the issue or need your project is addressing
4. State your area of interest for disseminating that information/knowledge (Extension or Education)
5. Define your target audience, be specific (if education, which grade level, type of class; if extension, dryland wheat growers or no-till farmers, not stakeholders etc.)
6. What are you planning on doing and how does it directly meet the perceived need?
7. Describe all outcomes or impacts you expect to see from use of your product:
8. Resources (briefly describe any resources that your project will require, this may include specific REACCH faculty time)
